June 3 to 9, 2007, Annapolis Royal, NS

The goal of the *Celebration of the Environment and Sustainable Living in Annapolis Royal* is to show the links between our cultural and natural history and how a healthy environment is critical for a vibrant and economically and culturally sustainable community. This will be achieved by a week long celebration of our cultural and natural history.

Sunday June 3rd, 2007

9am— Installation of Biodegradable Art on the French Basin Trail and will be on exhibit all week.

1pm—3pm The Great Annapolis Royal Pick-up. Meet at Annapolis Royal Train Station. Bring your own gloves.

1pm—3pm Children's Art Project at ARCAC. Children Primary to Grade 5 welcome.

Opening Weekend for the Sinclair Inn Museum. Explore this 300 year old building and learn about Annapolis Royal's historic construction techniques and personalities. Be sure to meet the "Ghosts" of the Sinclair Inn.

Opening Weekend for North Hills Museum. Home of the Robert Patterson collection of Georgian antiques, is an ideal location to spend a peaceful afternoon. This season, the museum is starting a wild bird feeding program so that visitors can see some of our local fauna.

All Week—display of the Salt Marsh Exhibit at the Historic Gardens Interpretive Centre— provides great information on Salt Marsh ecosystems.

Monday June 4th, 2007

3pm—Opening of the Natural Wastewater Filtration System, the ribbon cutting of the Clean Annapolis River Project, and the kick off for Environment Week.

Preview of the *Annapolis during the Age of Sail* exhibit at the O'Dell House Museum. This re-vamped exhibit focuses on the role of shipping and shipbuilding in the Annapolis Royal area during Nova Scotia's Golden Age of Sail. Monday to Friday.
